Fishing

Key West is a fisherman's paradise. Choose from deep sea, flats, back country, offshore or reef light tackle fishing. Come and fish in the waters of Key West where fishing legends were born. Ernest Hemingway fished the waters of the Florida Straights between Cuba and Key West for giant blue marlin. Zane Grey applied his angling and writing skills to the in-shore and backcountry of the Florida Keys, landing sailfish and giant tarpon.



Scuba Diving or Snorkeling

Seven miles off shore is the 3rd largest coral reef in the world. See brilliantly hued fish, rays, turtles, sharks and more. See over 400 species of tropical fish & coral while snorkeling in the shallow waters that surround North America's only living coral reef. Available for all levels of experience.

Dolphin Encounter

Bottlenose and spotted dolphins are gentle and intelligent. Take a trip through the beautiful Caribbean waters to see them in their natural habitat. Swim & snorkel in the shallow turquoise waters of the marine sanctuary.



Parasailing

It's a Whole New view of Key West! Parasail 600 feet above the island, solo, tandem, or even 3 people together. See over the entire island and spot wildlife in the water below. Take off and land right on the boat. You can stay dry or have the optional dip.

Glass Bottom Boat

See colorful coral, exotic tropical fish, and hundreds of varieties of marine life, without getting wet. The whole family can enjoy this fascinating and educational adventure.

Dry Tortugas National Park

Located 70 miles west of Key West, The Dry Tortugas National Park boasts some of the best snorkeling in North America. Whether you're a beginner or expert, you can enjoy a myriad of tropical fish and living coral. Explore the Civil War Fort (including the cell of Dr.

Samuel Mudd), snorkel, sunbathe and observe the amazing Frigate birds. Snorkeling is in 4-7 feet of water straight off a white sandy beach. Just bring your bathing suit and towel.



Jet Ski Tour

Take a trip around the entire island of Key West on your personal jet ski. Wander through the mangroves, cruise past Civil War forts and view ocean life up close. You can travel through the Gulf of Mexico and the Atlantic Ocean, even stop at a sand bar and take a swim, and still have plenty of time to play around!! Keep your

eyes open for dolphins, rays, turtles, and birds.

Kayaking

Glide across warm crystal clear water only inches deep to the shelter and seclusion of mysterious mangrove islands. Swim, snorkel, kayak or just enjoy a walk along the beaches at low tide. A wonderful way to spend a day in the Florida Keys viewing birds and aquatic life in a natural serene habitat.

Truman's Little White House

"I've a notion to move the capitol to Key West and just stay." (Letter to Bess Truman, March 13, 1949) While president, Truman spent 175 days in Key West at Quarters A on the Truman Naval Station. Today, as Florida's only presidential museum, the Little White House provides a personal glimpse of one of America's greatest presidents.

Mel Fisher Museum

In 1622 the treasure laden Spanish ship, Atocha, broke up on Key West's coral reef. In the 1970's Mel Fisher discovered the ship and the treasure, which is still being salvaged. See the treasure whose loss caused an economic depression in 15th century Europe.



Pirate Soul

View one of the largest collections of Pirate memorabilia in the world including one of only 2 Jolly Roger flags known to exist and the only known authentic Pirate Chest. Step back into the Golden Age of Piracy, over 300 years ago, and witness how pirates lived, fought and died.

Hemingway House

Explore the tranquil environment where one of America's foremost authors and Nobel Prize winner, Ernest Hemingway, penned many of his most notable works. Visit the descendents of his legendary cats. Step back in time with a guided tour of the home and gardens.

Ripley's Believe It Or Not

Key West Aquarium

Perhaps one of the most unique aquariums in the world, the Key West Aquarium has delighted visitors since 1934. Open for business during the Great Depression, the Aquarium was Key West's first attraction. A Window of Wonder comes alive as expert guides explain the mysteries of the water surrounding the Florida Keys. Daily

shark and turtle feedings and the Touch Tank offer guests hands on experience with sea life. The Aquarium features a wide variety of fish including grouper, moray eels, barracuda, tropical fish, tarpon, sharks, parrotfish and much, much more.

Key West Butterfly & Nature Conservatory

The Key West Butterfly & Nature Conservatory has been voted by The People's Choice Awards the #1 Attraction in Key West for the past four years. The Conservatory is truly a magical experience filled with lush tropical vegetation & cascading waterfalls, all under a climate-controlled, glass-enclosed habitat. There are 1,500 free-flying Butterflies from all over the world, birds, tropical foliage & waterfalls.
